### **Wreaths Across America**

The annual Wreaths Across America wreath laying ceremony was held December 18, 2020 at Camp Chase Confederate Cemetery located at 2900 Sullivant Avenue on the Hilltop. Each December, National Wreaths Across America Day is held across our nation and abroad, with wreaths being placed at Veterans graves. The first ceremony was held at Arlington National Cemetery and has expanded to over 2,100 cemeteries. Wreaths are purchased by private individuals, charitable and fraternal organizations, and corporate sponsorships to be placed on graves in designated cemeteries.

hallowed ground was erected in 1902, a statue of a soldier sits atop the arch, above the word, "Americans."

This year many volunteers met at the cemetery to decorate over 400 graves. The **John Hoover** Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) raised funds for many of these wreaths. This DAR chapter meets in Grove City, Ohio and some of the organizing members are West High Alumni, Ruth McDermitt Hegele June '57, Ginger Thrush '79 and Lora Thrush Yank '83.

This year over 400 wreaths were placed on veterans' graves at Camp Chase. During the Civil War, Camp Chase was a large Union Army camp where soldiers were mustered in and out of military service. It was also a large prisoner of war detention Camp for captured Confederate soldiers. The cemetery is the only part of the vast camp that remains. 2,260 men are buried



What a shame.

### **Congratulations Cheryl Holt '65**

John Morlan '65 and his wife Susan sent in this article about Cheryl Holt who is a friend and classmate of John's. Cheryl was voted Best Female Athlete in 1965 at West and she continues to impress today. This article is reprinted with permission of the author Cody Bush, Austin Peay State University, Director of Athletics Communications, May 7, 2019.

Brentwood, Tenn. – (ESPN Clarksville) Cheryl Holt, who served in Austin Peay State University's athletics department in various roles for nearly 35 years, has been selected to the Ohio Valley Conference Hall of Fame. She will be inducted during ceremonies held in conjunction with the OVC Spring Meetings in May.

Inducted into Austin Peay's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2012, Holt joined the Governors athletics program in 1982 as a tennis coach but was tapped by then Director of Athletics Johnny Miller to elevate the volleyball program. She served just two seasons as tennis coach, but her tenure as volleyball coach lasted much longer – an impressive 23 seasons.

Holt ultimately amassed 364 career wins as the Govs volley-ball head coach. Under her leadership, the Govs qualified for the OVC volleyball tournament in 19 consecutive seasons, capturing the tournament title in 1991 and the regular season crown in 1992.

However, it was mentoring student athletes where she made the most significant impact. She coached 21 All – OVC selec-

tions, including OVC Players of the Year Connie Caldwell and Isabel Canedo.

In addition, Holt's volleyball teams annually were at the top of the athletic department's rankings regarding grade point aver-

age and graduation rates. In 1997, Holt was named the athletic department's first Senior Woman Administrator and in 2003 was elevated to assistant athletics director. She held both positions until her retirement in 2017.

In addition to her induction in Austin Peay's Athletics Hall of Fame, the Austin Peay community recognized Holt's significant contributions to women's athletics, including the softball program initiation in 1986,

by naming the softball facility Cheryl Holt Field.

Holt becomes the 10th member of the Austin Peay family inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame. The OVC Hall of Fame recognizes coaches, administrators, faculty and staff members who have been associated with the league for at least five years and have had extensive outstanding service to the Conference.



#### Pitt State Athlete of the Week - Antonio Givens '16

**Antonio (Tony) Givens** is a proud 2016 West High alum that will do good things after his college days are over. He was a great kid at West and is proof that West continues to graduate superior students and athletes.

This picture was in a Pittsburg State (Kansas) publica-

tion when Tony was named their Athlete of the Week. Tony transferred to Pitt State from Kent State University and is currently playing his second season on the men's basketball team. At 6'8", he has already earned a bachelor's degree in general studies

at Pitt State and is now a first-year graduate student working toward a master's in health, human performance, and recreation.

Tony first attended Wabash Valley College. As a sophomore there he averaged 3.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game in the 2017-2018 season and shot 62.5 percent from the field.

He then transferred to Kent State where he redshirted his only year there before transferring to Pittsburg State.

Tony said he grew up playing little league football on the westside starting at about five until he was 13. He played with a local team, Ohio Dynasty, before joining the program All-Ohio.

He didn't participate in sports his freshman year at West, but

#### **MEMORABILIA**

The current Alumni Association was started in 1992. Our first president, **Dean Potts '59 Jan**., asked one of the first alums to join, **Alberta Seely Schneider '47**, to start a file of any West High memorabilia, newspaper clippings, historical information - anything having to do with West, its students, and alumni. When Alberta's health started failing, she asked me if I would take it over. Since then the amount of memorabilia we have had donated by our alumni has grown substantially. We have graduation programs, school programs, pictures, scrap books, school newspapers, newspaper articles about alumni - you name it, we have it.

We would like to have someone take what we have and organize it and document what we have. Possibly a couple of friends could take on this project together and split the materi-

al into categories. We already have some of the material documented in computer records that we will share with whomever would be willing to take this project on.

When possible, we have taken some of these items to the Hilltop Bean Dinners, the Christmas Luncheons, and to class reunions. We don't want to store these things away and not allow our alumni to see them. We like to share these wonderful reflections of our days at West. When going to class reunions, it helps when we can look at our records and see what we have for the reunion years. Whomever would take on this project would probably need to take everything to his or her house to sort and document. Once this was done, the documents could be returned to where we store other Association materials. We would like the person doing this to maintain a computer record of everything documented and update it when other items are donated.

### YEARBOOK SALES

We have about 300 yearbooks available to sell. All of these have been donated by alumni, retired teachers, West High, or the families of deceased alums. The proceeds from our yearbook sales go to our Scholarship Foundation. Whomever would take over this project would only need to keep one of each year we have available to sell at their home. Once one is sold, if another yearbook is available to sell for that year, we have them at a storage facility. The ones we sell are stored in two 'banker boxes.' We have a list of alumni who want to buy a yearbook. Whenever yearbooks are donated, the list of those who want a yearbook needs to be checked to see if the newly

donated yearbook is on our Wait List. There are currently about 200 people waiting on yearbooks (obviously for years we do not currently have).

If you think you might like to be our Association Historian / Archivist or oversee our yearbook sales, give me a call and we can talk about what our needs are and how you can help. A computer is necessary to keep a record of our memorabilia and to keep a record of the yearbook sales.




### **Nancy Wilson Way**
