"Writing this feels quite surreal. Although I always wanted to go to college, I am still in awe that I graduated recently.

I was born in Kenya as were many of my brothers and sisters. We were refugees and moved to America when I was about 8 months old. My siblings and parents moved to the west side of Columbus where we lived in South Park for the next 21 years.

Even though I am the third youngest of 9 siblings, I was the first in my family to go to college. It was not something that was encouraged in our home. I was expected to just

keep my head down and find a job that would pay the bills. Dreaming big and working for that dream was left to me.

I graduated from West High School in 2015. I played volleyball, was involved in student council, made the National Honor Society, and took engineering courses while maintaining a high GPA. I loved what West offered to us. My AP Government course with Mr. Murray gave me the desire to pursue

politics out of high school. My relationships with my peers and our side of town made me want to become a person who could influence things to be better for us. It was here that I met Joy Hostetler, our school social worker, who provided support beyond the walls of West High. West made me who I am, and I felt confident taking that into college.

With a generous scholarship from the West High School Alumni Association, I set off to Wittenberg University. In my first year, I ran for student body president and worked at the

Diversity Center part-time to help pay for school. However, after two years, I felt more lost than when I started. I was unsure of my path and felt disconnected from Wittenberg because many of my peers could not relate to me. I did not feel at home.

I decided to take a gap year and worked back in Columbus as a nanny for two of my previous West High School teachers, Lisa and James Murray. The gap year

was reaffirming and encouraging. Remembering the influence that Joy Hostetler had on me all those years at West, I applied to Columbus State to pursue Social Work.



After two semesters at Columbus State, I applied to Ohio State's Social Work program in 2019. I am now a graduate of that program. During my time at Ohio State, my peers came from all over Columbus, all with different stories. This diversity reminded me of West in a way. It was wonderful being back home.

Being at Ohio State, the confidence I once felt leaving high school was flourishing again. I recalled my desire to help my community through politics and that thinking led me to pursue higher education in law. After rigorous studying for the LSATs, and superb recommendations from Joy Hostetler and Sean Delaney (who was at West as an Ohio State Master of Social Work student intern!) I got admitted to the Ohio State Moritz College of Law where I start in August.

It has been quite the journey. I learned so much along the way. What has been consistent though was my connection to West High, and the west side of Columbus in general. I needed to focus on that part of me, and it was clear that the decisions that strayed me away from that did not bode well for my academic pursuits. Returning to that desire I had at West, and the desire to chase the dreams I had as a young immigrant girl, has played a significant role in my academic successes."

So, what happened, that in my later years I picked up the pen? I believe Writers write, because of emotional motivation or what I just call "Heart issues." For those



#### West High School Senior Graduates Early Despite Global Pandemic

February 17, 2021 – 17-year-old senior Laileona Sydnor has already graduated from West High School and picked up her diploma. "She was so motivated to finish high school," said Maria McClain, Laileona Sydnor's school counselor at West. "She completed all her state and Columbus City School graduation requirements so she could graduate early."

A high school diploma is one more accomplishment

Laileona has achieved in her young life, which has been far from easy. "10 years ago, my little brother died from heart complications when he was two years old," said Sydnor. "At the age of 12, I was sexually assaulted. I've tried to commit suicide. My mom has issues with drugs and is still in recovery."

Laileona Sydnor talks candidly about her upbringing. She's not shy; quite the contrary. Laileona feels talking openly about it might help others recover.

"I refuse to let the abuse define me," said Laileona Sydnor. "It's hard, but I'm not going to be the victim. I have a wonderful therapist at Nationwide Children's Hospital. I currently live with my grandparents and younger brothers."

In her college essays, Laileona
Sydnor writes about her childhood,
which also includes a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.
When Laileona was 16 years old, she was invited by
the YMCA Hilltop branch to go to London, England, to
celebrate the Y's 175th Anniversary. "I was the youngest
person in the group," said Sydnor. "The trip was unbelievable. The YMCA paid for everything; hotel, airfare, food,
even spending money while I was there."

Currently, Laileona works several jobs, but her favorite is her part-time position at the National Alliance on Mental Health Ohio (NAMI), a non-profit, grassroots organization that advocates for mental health issues. Laileona Sydnor plans to go to college. "I want to be a professional mental health counselor," said Sydnor. "I think I have so much to offer and can help teenagers like me."

Laileona Sydnor's first choice is The Ohio State Univer-

sity (OSU). "I have dreamed of going to OSU since I was a little girl," said Sydnor's whose bedroom is painted scarlet and gray and decorated with everything Buckeye from floor to ceiling.

Laileona is also considering enlisting in the Army National Guard. "I was in Junior Army ROTC for two years at West," said Sydnor. "Military service could help me pay for my college education."

During high school, when things got tough, Laileona Sydnor would focus on her schoolwork as a way to cope. She also uses music. "I am a free-style rapper, and several of my songs are posted on YouTube," said Sydnor.

"Her ability to think on her

feet and just belt out a tune is pretty remarkable," said West High School Counselor Maria McLain. "You can give her words or phrases, and within seconds, Laileona is rapping about it."

With a diploma in hand, Laileona Sydnor is excited and looking forward to the next step in her journey of serving others.
