administrator at West High School, as well as the acknowledgment for involvement within the community for service and volunteerism is very humbling as I have strived to make a difference in the success of others throughout the years.



Dan Martin, '72



Mr. Dan Martin class of 1972, was welcomed back into the hallways of West High School (WHS) in 2008, appointed to the leadership position by the Superintendent of the Columbus City Schools (CCS). Having spent his life growing up in the district, the alum was honored to claim his association with WHS as a student, leader, athlete, teacher, coach, and eventually principal. Were it not for the lessons he learned and developed throughout his education in the CCS system,

particularly his accomplishments at West, he believes he would not have been afforded the success and experience in life that brought him full circle back to those WHS halls.

Mr. Martin's return to West High School was almost inevitable. Growing up in the Hilltop schools, Dan was encouraged by his middle school Secretary, at the time, (Mrs. Haynes) to work in the middle school office. Dan's leadership and interest in school operations continued when he was co-chairman of the West Safety Club and member of "Future Teachers of America."

No education is complete without sports - and Dan was a standout at West and beyond. As a student, he participated in Track, Wrestling, and Football. His sophomore year he was on the 1969 City Reserve Championship Football Team and also earned a letter in Wrestling as well as receiving awards in track. During his senior year, Dan excelled in football as a defensive linebacker and offensive fullback. That same year, he received his second letter in football and was the second-highest award winner of Stars For Exceptional Play as well as being designated the team's Most Improved Player. For his hard work on the gridiron, Dan received All-City Football Honors after the 1971 season. During high school, he also was a member of Varsity W, Student Council, and served as the treasurer of Hi-Y. It was by way of football that Dan earned the financial aid necessary to attend The Defiance College in northwest Ohio, where he would go on to earn a degree in Comprehensive Business Education. While at Defiance, his leadership continued as a member of the Student Senate and the Football team. Dan was a four-time letterman and received both league and district Football honors during his sophomore and junior years.

Upon graduation from Defiance in1976, Columbus City Schools hired Dan to teach business classes at North High School. He spent several years teaching Office Education and coaching both

football and wrestling. Due to the busing issue, North closed, so Dan decided to try something new – bank management. As a management trainee, his training included volunteerism within the community in the way of a three-month stint as a Loaned Executive with United Way. His performance was at such a level that United Way persuaded his employer to allow him to continue his assignment for an additional three months. Upon his return to working as a banker, he was assigned as an assistant manager to a branch where duties were given to lead the branch office to be the first to come "online" with technology, then train other offices to install the system within the organization. The opportunity presented itself to learn about computers and data processing. Dan ultimately found his way back to teaching in the CCS district in1985. The advanced computer skills learned allowed him the chance to teach his newly found knowledge at Fort Hayes, where he remained until 2004.


As an instructor of Data Processing, Business Computer Information System, and Cooperative Office Education, Dan planned curriculum, cultivated employment worksites, placed students in entry-level work positions, and provided daily instruction to students in the use of personal computers for business applications. Dan developed a hands-on shadowing experience for students within the Office of the Secretary of State, The Limited, the Ohio Bureau of Worker's Compensation, and *The Columbus Dispatch*, to name a few. In addition, he taught adult education computer classes in the evenings, as well as conducted keyboarding training as an instructor for Columbus State Community College for members of the American Bankers Association.

Dan remained active in the schools and his community by serving as the President of Columbus and Metropolitan Area Coordinators (CMAC) and President of the Columbus Ohio Federal Teachers Credit Union. As a community volunteer, Dan became an active member of the Charity Newsies Organization serving underprivileged school children. Their mission states, "no child shall be kept out of school for lack of adequate clothing." Dan served as a board member, officer, and eventually President. Through his work in the classroom and with Charity Newsies, Mr. Martin was recognized by the CCS Board with an "Apple Award", presented for developing classroom shadowing work experience for students and by providing assistance for vocational uniforms by way of Charity Newsies. Dan recently completed a three-year stint as President of his church council, but he continues as the Treasurer of his church's Men's Club. Also, he has recently become President of the West High Alumni Association.

Throughout his career, Dan has held tight to the historic WHS Motto, "Wisdom, Honesty, Sincerity". Upon his "full circle" return as Principal of West in 2008, Dan's daily goal for staff and students was to share and instill this Motto with the student body



Dr. George A. Marzluf, '53



Dr. George A. Marzluf was born on September 29,1935. He spent his entire childhood living in the Hilltop neighborhood of Burgess Avenue in Columbus, Ohio. Throughout his life, no matter where it took him and what he was doing, George always considered himself a product of the Hilltop and was proud of his Westside roots.

George was the oldest of four siblings born to Faun and Paul Marzluf. He graduated from

West High School in 1953 and attended The Ohio State University. While a student, he served as President of Civitas as well as in the Student Senate. He graduated in 1957, Summa Cum Laude, receiving a Bachelor of Science Degree. While at OSU, he joined the Army National Guard leading him to attend and graduate from the Officer's Candidate School at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. He then served as a lieutenant in the Ohio National Guard, eventually rising to the rank of Captain.

After teaching at Cleveland's John Adams High School for one year, he returned to OSU and received his Master's Degree. He continued his studies at Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland and received his Ph.D. in 1965. After teaching several years at Marquette University, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Dr. Marzluf returned to OSU's Department of Biochemistry in 1970. He would remain on the faculty of OSU for over four decades.

George was both a gifted teacher and researcher. He was able to obtain strong grant funding for his varied programs, as well as mentoring over 36 graduate students, including 14 PhD's while at OSU. His prolific research career and accomplishments were widely recognized by many. He was awarded the NIH Career Development Award as well as The Ohio State University Distinguished Scholar Award in 2000. This competitive award is the highest recognition given to a senior faculty member who has exhibited an aptitude for exceptional scholarly achievements.

Based on this outstanding record, Dr. Marzluf served as the Chair of the Legacy Department of Biochemistry between the years of 1986 and 2000. As a faculty member, he also served in the University Senate, the Senate Rules Committee, the Faculty Council, the Distinguished Scholar Awards Committee, and others. He was known for being well organized, challenging, and highly effective by everyone who knew him.

Eventually George retired from being a full-time professor in 2011, but continued to teach as an adjunct until 2015. Overall, George was a very successful scientist, being published well over 100 times and was recognized in 2008 for the faculty award in addition to the others previously mentioned.

When not working in the classroom and laboratory, George was busy as a lifelong outdoorsman; his primary passion was fly-fishing. He authored books, fly fished all over the world, and was an active member of Central Ohio Fly Fishers and the Zanesfield Rod and Gun Club for many years. He was a rare individual, who was comfortable without creature comforts in the most remote places in the world – snowbound in Alaska fishing for Salmon while on the lookout for Grizzlies, or along the Amazon River in Brazil looking for crocodiles, or primitive camping anywhere fishing could be had! So it may be surprising that he was equally happy and comfortable at a symphony, the opera, or viewing theater on Broadway.

His passions often moved into new areas, as George was a lifelong learner. In his final years, he continued to learn new things: deciding to take up Astronomy, joining book clubs, classes, and even learning new languages on his own.

George was also a family man. While in Columbus, before leaving for Graduate School, he married Sandra Tesmer. They had three children: Bruce, Julie, and Phillip. In 1971, George married Dr. Jackie Rice, and they had a son, Glenn. His last marriage in 1998, which was the longest, was to Dr. Zarife Sahenk. Zarife and George lived in Clintonville and were able to travel extensively until George's health started failing in 2016.

He had a love of reading, good wine, and rarely passed on a good desert. His friends and family miss his smile, wit, and sense of humor. George died on May 4, 2017. He would be very pleased and proud of being honored in the West High School Hall of Fame. He regularly attended his West High Class Reunions and always considered himself to be a west sider.

Linda Lee Schuler, '64



Linda Lee Schuler was born on May 25, 1946, in Charleston, South Carolina. She and her parents, Anthony Leo and Virginia Maxine Schuler, moved to the Westside of Columbus when she was an infant. Although she is a true Charlestonian, she claimed Columbus as her hometown. Linda cherished her time at West High School and was a member of the esteemed Weskets Drill Team and was a class speaker at her graduation. Linda was very proud to be able to address her

classmates. The theme of her speech was "*Age is just a Number*" and you should never let it keep you from achieving your life's purpose.

Linda began her college education in political science, but ended with receiving a Bachelor's Degree in Speech and Theatre from The Ohio State University. Upon completion of her degree, Linda started her career at the Columbus Recreation and Parks Department. While there, she founded the Park Playhouse Children's Drama Company. This was later followed by her appointment as the Senior Center Director, a position she held for 30 years until her retirement in 1999.

Linda settled in Victorian Village in the mid-1970's and became an Urban Pioneer. She was one of the first women in Columbus to receive a loan to purchase, renovate, and restore property. Linda was honored for her work in restoration in 2016, when the Short North Business Association chose her as one of their unsung heroes.

Linda met her wife, Karla Rothan in 1996 and they were married in 2018. They continued to fulfill their family mission of volunteerism, together, for over twenty-six years.

and increase academic achievement. He was often heard stating: "Bring Your Best to West Every Day" as an encouragement to foster daily academic success and future lifelong learning. He increased classroom participation and attendance at sporting events by creating classroom incentives using opportunities to earn "Cowboy Bucks" for academic achievement to purchase admittance to school events as well as at the concession stand and school store.

All the while, implementing safety measures to make the school a more student-friendly and safe environment for both students and

Linda chaired the Stonewall Columbus Pride Parade for twenty-two years, from 1997 – 2019. She was chosen as The Grand Marshal in 2002. Under her leadership, the parade grew from just 200 marching activists into a community wide event with public officials, churches, employee resource groups, and activists marching together to celebrate and support the LGBTQ+ community. In 2019, at the age of 73, Linda and her dedicated team produced one of the largest Pride marches in the United States.

Linda was also the driving force behind the creation and management of the Stonewall Columbus Trailblazer Program, which provides social, educational, and other opportunities for age 50+LGBTQ adults. Her outreach, creativity, persistence, and leadership to this often-overlooked group changed the lives of so many.

The Human Rights Campaign chose Linda as an Equality Award winner in 2012 and in 2019 she won the Steven Shellabarger Illuminator Award, which recognizes individuals within the Columbus community who have demonstrated outstanding initiative by promoting LGBTQ rights and creating a more inclusive Columbus.

In 2021, Linda was inducted into the Central Ohio Senior Citizens Hall of Fame and in 2023 she will receive the Legacy Fund Honors Award from the Legacy Fund of The Columbus Foundation.

In 2023, Mayor Andrew Ginther will induct Linda into the City of Columbus Hall of Fame, which honors outstanding individuals who, "through exemplary accomplishments, have gained national recognition for themselves and have brought credit to this City."

Linda's legacy is one of exemplary service and accomplishment, always striving to leave things better than she found them.

Linda passed away on October 1, 2022 at the age of 76. She is survived by her beloved spouse, Karla Rothan and her numerous, extended and chosen families and friends.



John Steven Williams, '69



John Steven Williams spent the first nine years of his life growing up in Mansfield, Ohio. He was a typical kid, except he carried around a camera. One of his favorite things to do was to assemble his green Army men or cars and set up scenes for his action photography.

John moved to Columbus with his family in 1960. He grew up on the west side, first attending Hilltonia Junior High followed by West High School. He became a member

of the Hi-Y, perhaps, because its purpose was "to create, maintain, and extend through the home, school, and community high standards of Christian character". John lived his life with Wisdom, Honesty, and Sincerity – WHS. During these years he was active in Boy Scouts of America and activities at Hogue Memorial Presbyterian Church. After graduating from West in 1969, he attended The Ohio State University and studied journalism. He became a freelance photographer and worked for one of the local community newspapers. Everywhere he went, he made friends and connections. He was often hired as a photographer to do weddings, take portraits, and shoot family pictures. During this time, he was busy raising three sons.

In 1994, a member of Governor George Voinovich's staff approached John to see if would like to work as the staff photographer to help document the Governor's Administration. John was both excited and honored to accept the position. John spent almost eight years "shooting George", as he called it. He also worked with other State Government Departments, including: Travel and Tourism, Natural Resources, and Agriculture. He traveled throughout Ohio with Governor Voinovich visiting the State Fair, the groundbreaking and the grand opening of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, as well as other events. He met Heads of State, politicians, rock stars, as well as the diverse

Also, his leadership led to several projects to update the building ascetically as well as becoming technically advanced to generate student success. The academic programs implemented led to West being designated and featured on Channel 6 news feeds as a "Cool School".

The CCS Motto is "Each student is highly educated, prepared for leadership and service, and empowered for success as a citizen in a global community." The history and life's work of Dan Martin as a Columbus City Schools' student, athlete, educator, principal, residents of Ohio. John was always humble, treating everyone with dignity and respect. He could be seen cracking jokes with travel writers or eating Buckeyes with Bob Dole. He made all his subjects feel comfortable, while remaining in the background and getting the best shots, making everyone and everything look their best. When his time with the governor ended, he entered private life with many friendships, connections, and great stories that carried him into the next chapter of his life.

John continued photographing many events, both corporate and private. He was rarely seen without a camera. However, his true love was always nature photography. He enjoyed the serenity of nature and finding the little things, the right light, and the pieces of nature that most people missed. Photography was John's heart and soul. It was the one thing that brought him pleasure and peace.

John's other passion was motorcycles. For twenty years, he traveled with his wife beside him (on her own motorcycle) and a camera in his saddlebag, exploring new places and people. He visited over thirty states and Canada. Everywhere he went he found new friends, while capturing the beautiful scenes around him.

When John learned there was a group of his West friends who met monthly for lunch, he knew he had to attend. He was reunited with so many friends from years gone by. With a camera in one hand and his easy-going wit in the other, he took pictures of anyone who attended. His joy was sharing these photos with all his classmates. In 2019, John was able to attend his 50th Class Reunion. With his camera by his side, John was able to capture the many magical memories of the evening and felt great joy in sharing them with his beloved classmates.

John kept his illness private. His Multiple Myeloma got the best of him and he succumbed to this cancer on April 20, 2020. His wife Kathie and his sons Adam, Erik, and Brian survive John. Also surviving, are his special kids (stepchildren) Erin and Kyle as well as six grandchildren and a loving mother, Erma Williams.




